

Program Overview and Objectives

The 2015 Oncology Symposium will focus on results of health science research studies which influence decisions made in health care. This program will concentrate on the health care provider's approach to current treatment options for the older adult patient with cancer. No prerequisites are required - all physicians in all specialties, nurses and other interested health care professionals, are invited to join us as we explore the latest research.

By attending this conference participants should be

- Describe the impact of the growing and aging population on the future number of cancer cases;
- Describe how transplant utilization has changed for older patients with hematologic malignancy over time;
- Outline treatment options for breast cancer in the older population;
- Discuss radiotherapy management in the elderly population;
- Discuss the importance of staging cancers;
- Describe the role of palliative care in cancer patients;
- Review the options and indications for management of pancreatic cancer;
- Discuss workup and treatment options for bony
- Discuss individualized screening recommendations based on patient age, preference and comorbidities;
- Discuss services for adult-onset cancer survivors;
- Identify risk factors for chemotherapy toxicity in older
- Discuss unexplained anemia being a common type of anemia in older adults.
