



Farmers Market & SNAP

- Farmers Markets account for less than .01% of SNAP sales Nationally
- West Virginia receives over \$480 million in SNAP benefits annually
- What would the impact on West Virginia's economy be if .o1% of SNAP benefits were spent locally?

(billboard, Radio, flyer, brochures, yard signs tastings)












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THIS RESULTED IN NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE IN SNAP SALES

- Produce Prescriptions



Next Steps:

- Partnership with WV Food and Farm Coalition to launch a 3 year statewide farmers market campaign
- Pilot "Farm to Childcare" in partnership with American Heart Association and WV Healthy Children Project
- Increase focus on WIC redemptions
