WV Dietetic Licensure

As you know, WVAND with your help has been working hard to ensure we keep dietetic licensure. HB 3035 to sunset dietetic licensure was introduced to the House Government Organization Committee on Wednesday, January 12th. There are many steps in this process. Next the bill can "die" in committee OR be brought forward to the House for voting. The new year is here, and we are 3 months away from our Annual Conference & Expo. Are you ready to learn & network with fellow Dietitians? We are!




